

Soul Shop[™] for Youth Workers is a one-day workshop to equip youth pastors, youth leaders, camp directors, camp counselors and anyone else who works with young people to minister to those impacted by suicide. Special attention will focus on youth-specific issues of impulsivity, contagion, social media, mandated reporting and confidentiality. The training includes the creation of worship resource, training in suicide awareness and basic conversation skills, and how to extend the invitation to those who have been suicidal in the past to share their stories. This workshop engages the question of how to cultivate a soul-safe culture within your youth ministry.



Guest Speaker: **Mr. Peter Simenauer** of Coral Gables, FL. Mr. Simenauer was born to Jewish parents in Berlin in 1935 and the family was eventually able to escape from Nazi Germany when he was 5 years old. After Peter's father's harrowing escape from the concentration camp, the family made a daring but successful effort to cross from Germany into France and from the port of Marseilles were able to board a ship bound for South America, finally delivering them to Brazil. After a career in Brazil Mr. Simenauer immigrated to the USA where he has lived since, having worked in the tool and dye industry mainly in Toledo, OH. How he and his family coped and succeeded as refugees in several countries after escape from the Nazis is a story of fortitude and the finding of community and livelihood under daunting circumstances. Mr. Simenauer will also present at a Gwinn High School student assembly and will serve as a guest lecturer at NMU.

There is no reservation or fee to attend and all are welcome.


