The Outreach committee met on Thursday, November 16th – here are some of the highlights:

- We "tidied up" the Outreach of the Month calendar for 2024. There are a few moveable dates, but for the most part, it's done!
- Giving Tree: Yes, folks, once again we are joining with the Altar Guild to do the Giving Tree. This tree will accept the traditional warm outerwear: hats, mitten/gloves, scarves, and warm socks. Items for adults both for men and women are especially needed. Those items will be distributed to RATI, Ripple Effect, and Great Lakes Recovery. In addition, the tree will be decorated with gift wish cards for the youth at Lake Superior Village. The timing on the gift wish is short:
 - 1. the tree goes up on December 3 wish cards will be available on this date.
 - 2. any "unselected wish cards" will be returned to Lake Superior Village on December 15th
